The Snowflake Stake Academy building was assigned for establishment through a mission call from the prophet Wilford Woodruff of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. It became the home for secondary education in much of Northeastern Arizona and was originally completed and dedicated in 1901. Even though it burned to the ground on Thanksgiving Day, 1910, school was not interrupted and the people immediately began to rebuild. Upon completion, it was dedicated just three years later, on Thanksgiving Day, 1913, by President Joseph F. Smith, president and prophet of The LDS Church. The building was used by Snowflake High School for many years until it was declared unsafe in 1998, at which time a number of community citizens organized to restore and renovate the old building for future use as a public library as well as a site for special collections from the area.

Now 100 years later, we are having a centennial celebration of this distinguished old building, even as it undergoes another phase in its renovation process. To memorialize this event we will dedicate a time capsule with artifacts to be preserved for the future.

We would be honored with your presence at our short and informal commemoration on Wednesday, November 6, 1:00 p.m., on the front lawn of the Academy building.
